7. The Planning Secretary Report

Dr. David Hewick gave the following report and update to the Council.

1. 182. Long Lane Local Review

House in garden application refused under delegated powers. Appealed under the Local Review Procedure Refused Neighbour telephoned Planning secretary to relay both his delight at the refusal and his thanks to the Community Council.

2. Local Review Procedure

David circulated a letter which he written to Roger Mennie Head of Democratic and Legal. Services Dundee City Council with some constructive comments .He felt that the local Review Procedure was unnecessarily out of date and prolonged compared with other planning determinations.

3. Winnocks ,1 Gardyne Road

House (non statutorily protected) to be demolished .Replaced by 9 flats planners have applicant to change the application to retain original footprint. This is. In the Parish of Broughty Ferry and thus B.F.C.C retains planning influence even though in the East End Ward.

4. Conservation Area Appraisals

Proposed boundary changes to Forthill, Grove, and Reres Hill Conservation Areas

5. Proposal for a new conservation area in Broughty Ferry

David asked members to consider The 1930's social housing of distinct character located around Forthill Road,

Archer Street, Forthill Drive and Forthill place. They are similar to the 1920's former council housing in Logie Conservation Area.

David concerned over losing planning influence over West Ferry and its conservation area. Significant input from B.F.C.C. over time. C.C. Boundaries and Electoral Boundaries are different. Anomalies would arise The Community Council would still have residual planning influence over a considerable part of the enlarged East End Increase in elected members numbers having a need to attend our meetings.

Public Consultation over boundary changes is to begin in July.
