### **Everyday Packs for Older People**

Thanks to funding received from the Big Lottery Supporting Communities Fund we have been able to support the following project.

Working in partnership with Dundee Community Transport, HOPE - Helping Older People Engage, Grey Lodge Settlement and volunteers from GetLocalSupport.org we have put



together 'Everyday Packs' for distribution to the older people's community in Dundee.

The Everyday Packs will contain a small bottle of hand sanitiser and either a reusable washable face mask or 5 disposable masks.

These packs are for those who are:

- aged 55+
- socially isolated so who don't have any support networks in place that can get these items for them
- digitally excluded so are unable to purchase them online themselves
- who's general wellbeing will be improved as a result of receiving this.

We know that older people who have being shielding and who haven't been out the house for the past 15 weeks are concerned about going into a shop to purchase a mask and hope that this will be able to alleviate some of their concerns. These packs are designed as a helping hand to enable older people to get out safely in the first place.

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Given the Scottish Government's instruction that everyone is to wear a face covering in all shops from 10th July, referrals will be accepted <u>from Monday 13th July</u> and packs will be delivered approximately 1 week later.

You will need to provide the recipient's name, address, postcode, telephone number and date of birth. We require the phone number as we will need to be able to communicate with recipients in order to complete an evaluation.

### **New Managing Director Sought by Dovetail Enterprises**

Dovetail Enterprises are looking to hire a new Managing Director to help the business grow following the challenging COVID-19 period.

The Dunsinane Avenue-based charity provides training and employment for people who are blind, visually impaired and disabled.

The charity is known for supplying businesses with high-quality furniture produced by it's over 60 strong workforce.

The news comes after Chief Executive Ken Laing announced his intention to leave his post at Dovetail on July 15th. Existing board member Gavin Strachan will take up the role of interim General Manager until the appointment of the new Managing Director.



Outgoing Dovetail Chief Executive Ken Laing, said: "It has been a pleasure to work with such a capable and hard-working workforce for the last four and a half years. Dovetail has an important historic role within Dundee and wish the company every success for the future."

Interim General Manager Gavin Strachan, added: "We thank Ken for his time at Dovetail and the work he has put in over the years."

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COVID-19 has presented challenges for businesses during the recent period. However, Dovetail remains well equipped to continue providing quality and ranging products for many clients.

Gavin Strachan, continued: "We, like everyone else, followed Government advice to shut down production during the Coronavirus pandemic to make sure everyone was kept safe from the virus. Despite this time of uncertainty, we've received a good amount of orders from various organisations and I remain positive for the future."

The organisation will now begin the search for a new Managing Director to recruit the most qualified candidate.

#### **EU Settlement Scheme Support Available**

With less than a year until the closing date to apply for the European Union Settlement Scheme (EUSS), EU/EEA and Swiss citizens, living in Dundee, are being urged to make use of the available support and apply for settled status.

The settlement scheme is free and can enable EU, other EEA and Swiss citizens living in the UK, and their families, to continue to live and work in the UK after 30th June 2021.

Councillor Will Dawson, Dundee City Council's cross-party Europe Group chairperson, said: "We want to do everything we can to support the EU citizens living in Dundee to achieve settled status. There are very helpful services available to support applicants through the process.

"I would urge anyone who has any concerns, big or small, to reach out to these specialist services so they can provide assistance and clarity. The settlement scheme will run for a limited period of time until the end of June next year, but it is important that applications are submitted well before then."

Despite the ongoing challenges around Coronavirus, EUSS support services continue to operate to help EU citizens to apply for settled status.

Councillor Lynne Short, Equalities, Fairness & Older People spokesperson for Dundee City Council, said: "It's important that the EU citizens living in Dundee understand the extent of the support that is available to them.

"There are many local and national resources, delivered in different languages to help individuals or families. In addition to this, there is accessibility-friendly support to meet individuals' needs."

The Citizens' Rights Project Scotland and the Royal Association for Deaf People have organised a free British Sign Language (BSL) information and Q&A event to support EU/EEA/Swiss nationals and their family members with the EU Settlement Scheme.

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### **SCDC Updated Community COVID-19 Resource**

Supporting Communities Safely has been updated to reflect the latest changes to Scotland's COVID-19 response. **This** <u>free</u>, <u>online resource</u> developed by SCDC and Public Health Scotland, features a range of practical information and advice, with two new sections added.

The <u>Test and Protect page</u> includes details of the Scotland's contact tracing program, while the <u>restarting</u> <u>services section</u> provides a series of questions around how community groups could think about re-opening safely at an appropriate stage in Scotland's recovery.

### **Have A Go Activity Hampers**

Following the allocation and delivery of 90 'Have A Go Activity Packs' to older people, we were inundated with referrals from organisations, community groups and sheltered housing complexes looking to make multiple referrals for their service users which we couldn't meet the demand for.

We are still conscious of those who are normally socially excluded and how difficult it is to reach them in normal circumstances and how often the wardens or groups who contacted us on their behalf may be their only source of support.

We have been able to secure a small amount of additional funding which will allow us to make up some 'Have A Go Activity Hampers' which will go to older people (over 55) identified by organisations and groups from the Older People's Network as being socially isolated, digitally excluded and who are needing a little something to keep them going that will improve their wellbeing and positivity.

The hamper will include the same practical items that we included in the Activity Pack 1, such as the adult activity puzzles, colouring in books, colouring pencils, crossword, mindfulness activity book, word searches, etc. along with a Dial OP service information sheet for those needing support to make them aware of this service.



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These packs will be delivered by volunteers to the referring organisation for onward distribution.

Referrals will be accepted from organisations and groups only, who missed out on the activity packs for individuals. Self-referrals will not be accepted. Again, numbers are limited. Referrals will be accepted from <u>Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> July</u> with deliveries by GetLocalSupport.org volunteers taking place approx. 1 week later.

As the referring organisation, you will need to complete a very short evaluation with the older people who receive an activity item. We will send you the evaluation form following your referral.


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#### Specialist Services for Women - A Guide to Services
