



Editors Introduction

Welcome to the twenty seventh issue of the Dundee Partnership E-Bulletin.

We find ourselves several months into a completely novel situation, with many services across the city having to carry out their work very differently to how it was being done just six months ago. Despite the differences in our current ways of working, and the setbacks caused by covid-19, it is still important to reflect on the progress we were making as a city.

In August we published a joint [City Plan and Council Plan Progress Report](#). This covers progress made during 2019-20 and gives a good snapshot of our position in the period immediately before the covid-19 epidemic brought us into lockdown.

Both of the Plans include bold and ambitious targets and projects under our five key strategic themes of; Fair Work & Enterprise, Children & Families, Health Care & Wellbeing, Community Safety & Justice, and Building Stronger Communities. Sections in the report use infographics to highlight some of the achievements within each of the key themes and give examples of the work that has been carried out that helped Dundee be described as “the best city in the UK to live in”.

Overall, in the three years since the two Plans came into effect, approximately two thirds of all the indicators we are using to measure progress have shown improvements. Where progress has been less than aimed for, efforts will be made by the council and its partners to address this. Although the impact of covid-19 is likely to cause some disruption to these efforts, our city’s Recovery Plan will help us to minimise this over the coming months, as part of ‘building back better’.

Fairness and social inclusion are however both identified in the report as areas that still require a lot of work in order to achieve the vision set out for the city, so that we offer our citizens real choices and opportunities. Work towards these is taking place alongside creating a sustainable economy that brings jobs to the city and ensuring that the city enables a good quality of life.

All of our work across the five strategic themes can be linked to Scotland’s National Performance Framework and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (see pages 14-15 in the report), showing that as a city we work to nationally and internationally recognised standards and aims.

Going forward, I think it is fair to say that Dundee is still a city with ambitions and that as lockdown is eased, we will see more and more of our services and partners moving into a new normal in which efforts to make our city the best it can be are gotten back on track.

Police Scotland Survey

Police Scotland has an ongoing survey that has been running since the beginning of the year and we have had a great response. However, we don't seem to be getting as many responses from young people, the BME community and people from the more deprived areas.

Policing recognises that those within the most deprived areas are often more likely to witness crime in their communities and the resulting harm. We are really keen to get the views of these community groups and we are trying to develop our engagement strategy to ensure we reach all of Scotland.

Our most recent [data report](#) showed that unintentional injury fatality rates and admission rates are increasing in Scotland. There were 18,600 hospital admissions due to accidents in the home last year.

With more people of all ages spending more time in the home environment, and now with the easing of restrictions, there is an increasing challenge to raise awareness of the types of accidents that can happen and how they can be avoided.
